Subject: FastTrack entries included in June 2012 release of RDA Toolkit

The JSC established the FastTrack process for correction of typographical errors, addition or removal of examples, addition of terms to vocabularies, addition of references, clarification in wording, etc. The possible changes are discussed by the JSC representatives, not by the JSC constituencies. If a JSC representative thinks a possible change should be discussed by the JSC constituencies, the entry for that change is removed from the FastTrack process.

Listed below are the changes approved by the JSC since the April release of the RDA Toolkit; the changes will appear in the June 2012 release of the RDA Toolkit. Strikeout is used to show deletions. Double underlining is used to show additions unless an entire paragraph, entry, or example is being added and is labeled as being “new” in the document.

Record titles of royalty applying the instructions given under 9.4.1.4.1 (person with the highest royal status within a state, etc.), 9.4.1.4.2 (consorts of royal persons), or 9.4.1.4.3 (children and grandchildren of royal persons) as applicable.

editor of compilation A person, family, or corporate body contributing to an expression of a collective or aggregate work by selecting and putting together works, or parts of works, by one or more creators. The editor of compilation may also be involved in elucidating the content, e.g., adding an introduction, notes, or other critical matter, of the compilation. For compilations of data, information, etc., that result in new works, see *compiler*, I.2.1.

Glossary, 4to [new entry]

4to Quarto; a book format consisting of one or more leaves that are ¼ of the whole sheet.

Glossary, 8vo [new entry]

8vo Octavo; a book format consisting of one or more leaves that are 1/8 of the whole sheet.

=====

Glossary, 12mo [new entry]

12mo Duodecimo or twelvemo; a book format consisting of one or more leaves that are 1/12 of the whole sheet.

Glossary, 16mo [new entry]

16mo Decimo-sexto, sexto-decimo, or sixteenmo; a book format consisting of one or more leaves that are 1/16 of the whole sheet.

Glossary, 24mo [new entry]

24mo Vigesimo-quarto or twenty-fourmo; a book format consisting of one or more leaves that are 1/24 of the whole sheet.

Glossary, 32mo [new entry]

32mo Trigesimo-secundo or thirty-twomo; a book format consisting of one or more leaves that are 1/32 of the whole sheet.

Glossary, 48mo [new entry]

48mo Forty-eightmo; a book format consisting of one or more leaves that are 1/48 of the whole sheet.

Glossary, 64mo [new entry]

64mo Sixty-fourmo; a book format consisting of one or more leaves that are 1/64 of the whole sheet.

Glossary, Chorus Score:

A score of a work for solo voices and chorus showing only the parts for chorus, at least in those portions of the work in which the chorus sings, with the instrumental accompaniment either arranged for keyboard(s) or other chordal instruments(s) or omitted.

Glossary, Embossed:

A production method for tactile resources using either a metal or plastic sheet as a master or embossing equipment (often in combination with a computer and specialized software) to produce braille and Moon copies. Use for "plate copy" or "press braille" or braille generated using Braillo equipment. Also use for "dotty Moon" (where the Moon characters are embossed as lines of dots), including use of Tiger Embosser equipment.

Glossary, Female [new entry]:

Female The gender designation for woman or girl.

Glossary, Folio [new entry]

Folio A book format consisting of one or more leaves that are ½ of the whole sheet.

Glossary, Forty-eightmo [new entry as reference to 48mo]

Forty-eightmo 48mo ▼

Glossary, Fully Established [new entry]:

Fully Established Status of identification for an authorized access point when the data is complete.

Glossary, Gathering [new entry]

Gathering One or more pairs of leaves — made up of a folded sheet, a fraction of a folded sheet, or several folded sheets tucked inside one another — that together form a distinctive unit for binding purposes.

Glossary, High Reduction [new entry]:

High Reduction A reduction ratio between 31× and 60× for a microform resource.

Glossary, Hot Spot [new entry as reference to Swell Paper]

Hot Spot Swell Paper ▼

Glossary, Low Reduction [new entry]:

Low Reduction A reduction ratio less than 16× for a microform resource.

Glossary, Male [new entry]:

Male The gender designation for man or boy.

Glossary, Microcapsule Paper [new entry as reference to Swell Paper]

Glossary, Minolta Paper [new entry as reference to Swell Paper]

Glossary, Mixed Polarity [new entry]

Mixed Polarity A polarity in which colours and tones used for images are a mixture of those seen with the human eye and those opposite what the human eye would see.

Glossary, Negative [new entry]

Negative A polarity in which colours and tones used for images are opposite those seen with the human eye.

Glossary, Normal Reduction [new entry]

Normal Reduction A reduction ratio between 16× and 30× for a microform resource.

Glossary, Not Known (Gender) [new entry]:

Not Known (Gender) The gender designation when specific gender is unknown.

Glossary, Octavo [new entry as reference to 8vo]

Octavo 8vo ▼

Glossary, Positive [new entry]

Positive A polarity in which colours and tones used for images are the same as those seen with the human eye.

Glossary, Preliminary [new entry]

Preliminary Status of identification for an authorized access point when the data is taken from a description without the resource described in hand.

Glossary, Protocols, etc. [new entry]

Protocols, etc. Other distinguishing characteristic of a separately catalogued protocol, amendment, extension, or other agreement ancillary to a treaty, etc.

Glossary, Provisional [new entry]

Provisional Status of identification for an access point when the data is insufficient to establish an authorized access point representing the entity.

Glossary, Quarto [new entry as reference to 4to]

Quarto 4to ▼

Glossary, Sexto-decimo [new entry as reference to 16mo]

Sexto-decimo 16mo ▼

Glossary, Sixteenmo [new entry as reference to 16mo]

Glossary, Sixty-fourmo [new entry as reference to 64mo]

Sixty-fourmo 64mo ▼

Glossary, Solid Dot:

A production method for tactile resources in which solid plastic dots are heat sealed onto the surface of thin but strong paper.

=====

Glossary, Swell Paper:

A production method for tactile resources in which an image is printed on a special type of paper with embedded microcapsules of alcohol which burst when exposed to heat to make the surface of the paper swell up. Used for tactile graphics and for embossing text in Moon characters (linear Moon). Also known as: Minolta paper (brand name), microcapsule paper, hot spot.

Glossary: Thermoform:

A production method for tactile resources in which a collage master is covered with a sheet of plastic, which is heated and vacuumed to generate a copy of a model or diagram. Also known as: vacuum form.

Very High Reduction A reduction ratio between 61× and 90× for a microform resource.
