Meetings

The committee did not meet in person during 2010 but four teleconferences were held:

22nd October Appendices A,F,G; FRSAD

15th November Issues deferred until after release of RDA Internationalization: omission of initial articles

Publication of RDA

RDA was published in June 2010 in the RDA toolkit. The printed RDA was published in September.

Development of RDA

JSC continued to work with the co-publisher and IMT to address outstanding issues with the text, including user reported corrections.

Toolkit Development

JSC members and constituencies contributed to the development of the RDA Toolkit by testing and reviewing functionality.

Implementation

LC shared proposals for options and alternatives to be followed in US National Test.

Outreach

DCMI/RDA Task Group

Work on registration of the RDA element set and vocabularies continued throughout the year. The Groups also raised important questions with JSC regarding the future development of RDA as linked data.

The most significant issue is the question of whether an unconstrained version of the RDA element set is required for use by developers who have a requirement for bibliographic metadata but who do not wish to implement the FRBR/FRAD models.

Members of JSC met with task group members Diane Hillmann, Karen Coyle, and Jon Phipps at ALA Annual at which agreement was reached on the basic structure of the Registry and the implementation of a JSC sub-group to support the task group members.
