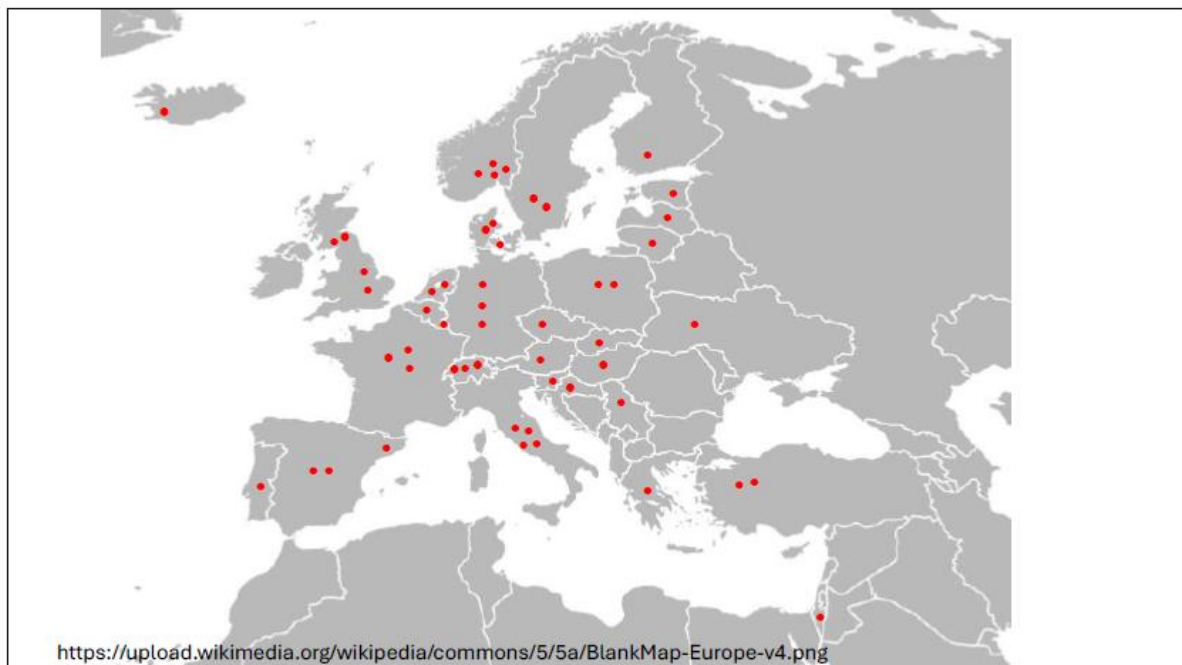

2 Minutes of the previous meeting and matters arising

The minutes of the previous meeting were made available online, and invitation to amend/approve resulted in some corrections and 18 formal approvals between June and September 2023.

3 Chair Report

The membership of EURIG remains strong with 53 member institutions from 30 nation states. We've had a few representatives retiring so there are some new appointments - welcome all, in particular to the new faces 'at the table'.



This past year has seen the RDA standard's development get going again, as Ahava's report will show, and therefore it is vital that EURIG members engage with the processes – not just to respond to proposals but also consider what proposals you would like to see being made.

EURIG exists to promote the interests of current and potential users of RDA in Europe, and to provide a forum for discussion and co-operation, where we can communicate and benefit from each others' experiences. We are also charged with the dissemination of information from the RSC, and to contribute to the development of RDA by working with the RSC.

The website was recently changed, we're still catching up with some of the broken links and so on. So it's given that we'll organise a meeting for 2025, but we need a host. Please get in touch if you're interested. I would like there to be a way to easily share documents, or access to documents, for the membership

Is there interest in a webinar, should EURIG make a proposal to the RSC, or submit a discussion paper....these are all questions I hope we can debate and address but more suggestions and feedback is very welcome.

We had a discussion about the new logo for EURIG and agreed to have an online vote to establish the favoured option, including making it possible for more suggestions to be made.

Hannes Lowagie, KBR representative, volunteered to be Vice Chair and was elected unopposed.

Emilie Sørine Ullerup, Royal Danish Library representative, volunteered to be Secretary and was elected unopposed.

7 Update on UNIMARC (remote presentation)

Florence Tfibel provided an update on UNIMARC development with respect to RDA, on behalf of the Permanent UNIMARC Committee. The presentation is attached as [Appendix 4](#).

8 Report from the European Bibframe Workshop 2023

Matias Frosterus reported on the activities of the Bibframe Workshop in Europe, his presentation is attached in [Appendix 5](#).

9 Group Discussion on Data Modelling and Aggregates

The delegates were split into 3 in-person and 2 online groups, and in separate rooms we held discussions with the prompt questions:

- What issues are you having with integrating RDA with your data models
- What solutions are you finding
- What additional problems are aggregates bringing to your data modelling
- What solutions do you need

Once reunited, the main points of each group's discussions were shared by a spokesperson for each group. A summary:

The cataloguing of aggregates does not yet have an established practice, though there is a growing desire for both supportive cataloguing interfaces and a common best practice, to produce reliable metadata.

The current heterogeneity in the way that aggregates can be described causes issues for discovery and data exchange; there is also an issue with legacy data rarely having sufficient data to be able interpret whether/which aggregated resource are involved.

The sorts of resources for which answers are sought:

- Illustrated works
- Sacred works with commentary
- Multi-expression resources with no clear 'original' language
- Multivolume works

LMS/data formats not only impact what we can do with our metadata, there is also an effect on training and education as it is difficult to explain concepts which are not explicitly handled in the LMS/data format.

Metadata can be legitimately called RDA compliant whilst being very basic, having an agreed RDA Application Profile for National Libraries would be helpful. This could also help with the issue of needing to produce clear, practical instructions.

The rare book community has issues with the handling of extent in RDA.

With different institutions implementing RDA in different ways it might be useful in future to examine those differences, and their consequences.

10 RSC Working Groups – How do they Work? (remote presentation)

David Roth, current Chair of the Religions in RDA Working Group, shared his perspective on being a member of a working group.

With the charge to "support the improvement of the RDA standard by reviewing the guidance and instructions (in all RDA entities) and making recommendations to move RDA toward unbiased and inclusive treatment of world religions", the WG uses Basecamp to share draft proposals and seek advice from other members on the best way to make RDA be general and not focused on the Christian communities' needs.

Topics are decided on the basis of need, i.e. if something has been noticed in use.

To date, the WG has made proposals to remove Religious Titles from base RDA (those options are now in the community resources section); and to change the instructions relating to terms of rank or office. Upcoming is a proposal on names of corporate bodies.

11 Close

At the end of our 2024 meeting, colleagues from the National Library of Sweden invited EURIG to meet in Stockholm in 2025.

The Chair thanked everyone for an engaging and productive meeting.

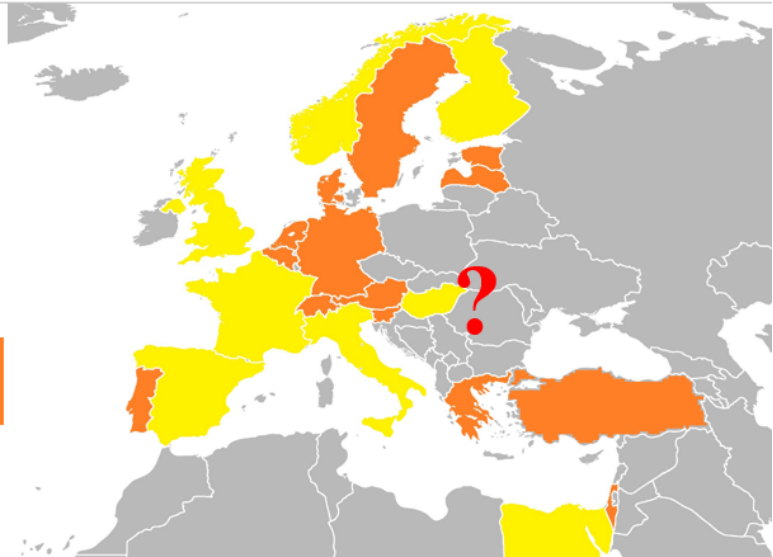

RDA and the toolkit are not freely available.

RDA: Business Models

Toolkit users expressed concerns about RDA's subscription costs.

Toolkit users suggest following models:

- Pricing dependent on the economic conditions of a region or of an organization.
- RDA should be freely accessible
- Creative Commons or other free license

3R: Impact on the toolkit

3R Project

- Change from cataloging rules to a “data dictionary” / framework
 - The Toolkit provides options rather than inflexible rules
- Catalogers need an application profile AP
 - The AP enables the use of the RDA according to local requirements
- AP: Integration into the toolkit or separate publication

Status quo : RDA Copyright

- Use of RDA logo
- Transcribing, translating, rewriting or adapting the Toolkit texts
- A manual based on the RDA Toolkit

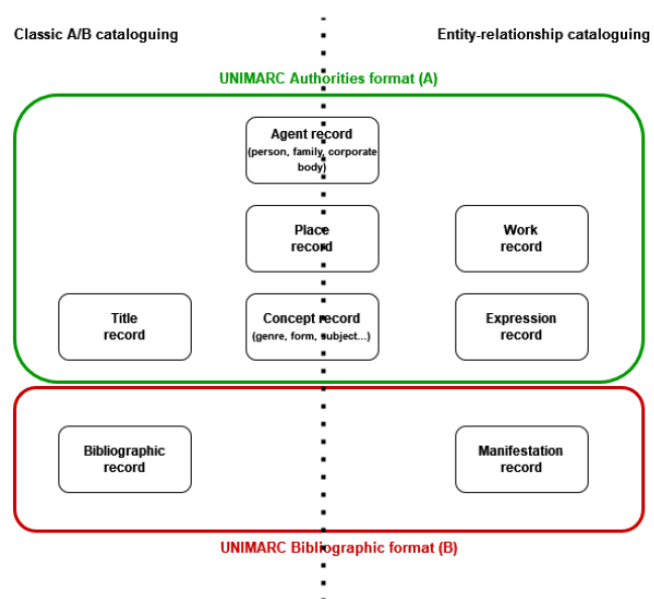

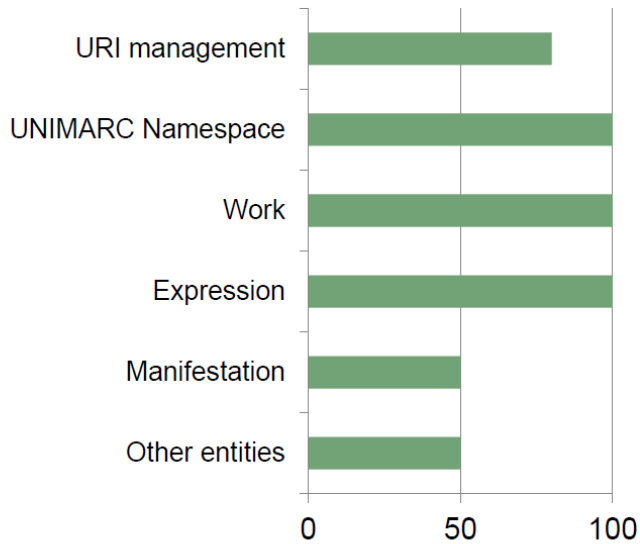

An experimental dataset



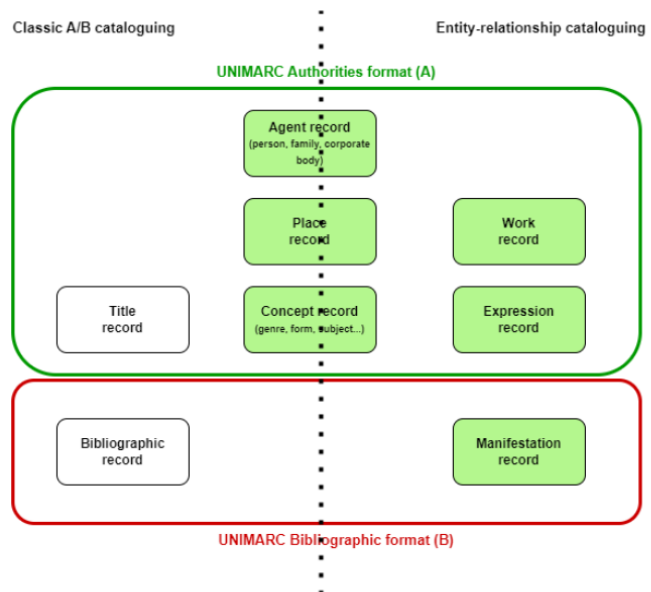

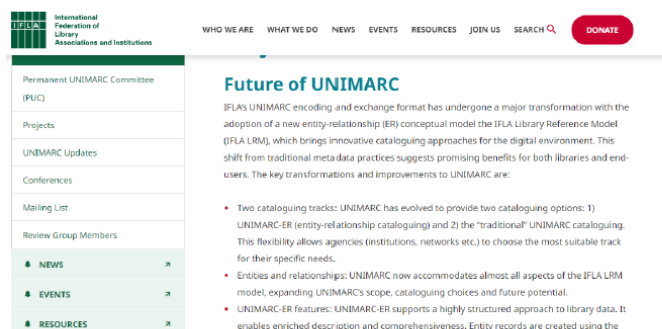

Report on BIBFRAME Workshop in Europe 2023

Held September 19th and 20th in 2023 in KBR Royal Library of Belgium

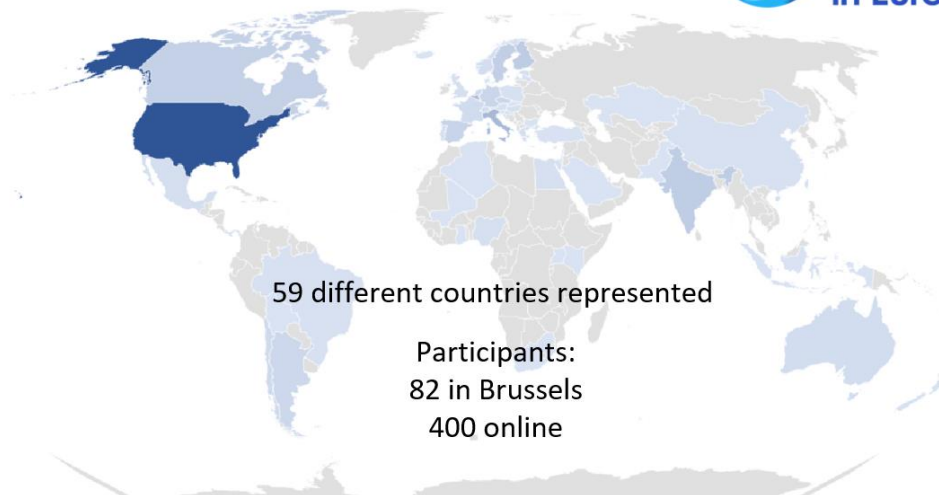
