Note 1: <u>EURIG</u> makes an offer: "If the Examples Editor feels the need for more examples or more languages (particularly languages which do not read left to right) EURIG would be happy to provide such."

Note 2: The <u>Examples Editor</u> "would appreciate an additional non-Western example in the proposal, but I am happy to work with NARDAC to add examples of personal names that include a variety of numeral types to the Toolkit."

Note 3: <u>ORDAC</u> identifies what it believes to be a related issue, "Numbers that are not regnal". They appear to be a different form of regnal number, with the number attached directly to the office title. They provide examples of Tibetan Buddhist names such as in the existing LC authorities:

Also the Māori monarch:

ORDAC explains this "was the seventh Māori monarch, but all six predecessors had different names."

Note 4: <u>TTWG</u> offers the following alternative wording:

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regnal number

A number used primarily in combination with <u>a given</u> names of monarchs and other royals or ecclesiastics <u>a person</u> in order to identify, sequence, or distinguish among persons who held hold an <u>regal or ecclesiastical</u> office under the same name.

A regnal number may be expressed as a roman numeral, or using another numbering system, such as an arabic numeral, a spelled-out number, or a combination of a numeral with a word, abbreviation, ordinal suffix or symbol.

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regnal number

A number used in combination with a given name of person in order to identify, sequence, or distinguish persons who hold a regal or ecclesiastical office.

A regnal number may be expressed as a roman numeral, or using another numbering system, such as an arabic numeral, a spelled-out number, or a combination of a numeral with a word, abbreviation, ordinal suffix or symbol.

The rationale behind the changes they suggest is given in RSC/NARDAC/2025/1/TTWGResponse.
